

- For the whole school, there is nothing significant or exceptional to highlight for total suspensions compared to all schools in 2021/22, therefore no conclusions can be drawn from this data.
- For the whole school, there is nothing significant or exceptional to highlight for repeat suspensions compared to all schools in 2021/22, therefore no conclusions can be drawn from this data.
- The 1 pupil in the whole school with at least one suspension in 2021/22 was suspended on more than one occasion but fewer than 10.
- Of the 3 total suspensions in the whole school in 2021/22, all were for persistent disruptive behaviour.
- There were no permanent exclusions in the whole school in 2021/22. The national average for this year was close to zero. However, there was 1 permanent exclusion in 2020/21 but none in 2019/20.
